BSA Health Form

- Last edition: 4/2014; old forms prior to current form available online will not be accepted.
- Only BSA Health Forms [i.e. no State CT Physical forms]
- You will get all paperwork back.
- **Part A:** Scout should be encouraged to sign “Participant”; after all they should be in agreement and know what they’re getting into.
- Participant Signature is needed for adults the adult is the participant that is agreeing to the “Consent” to be in camp. Not just a Boy thing.
- Recommend Both Parent Signatures; with todays split family’s and shared custody....enough said
- Need one adult authorized to take the Scout. At least one Scout Unit leader should be acknowledged to transport. Need this if Scout needs to leave grounds. With no signature, in a non-emergency situation, it will be a 911 call or the parent will need to come up and transport.
- Obvious on the “NOT” to transport.....
- **Part B p1:** If this is a physical that is not immediately current, please verify contact info of parent/guardians prior to submitting. Things change
- There should be some contact person who is available in an emergency for the Scout. Especially if parents are away during the time the Scout is in camp
- Insurance info should be at least in your Troops main file. In an emergency situation, Scout will be treated and then hospital will chase down info. Having it on the Health Office form just shortens transport/locate Unit copy.
- Health History needs to be fully completed. It’s what the medical provider is looking at to help care for Scout in an emergency situation. “Never Assume” because a box is left unchecked.

medications, not return/sign it [nothing can be given] if they don't want something/it followed. A parent cannot substitute other OTC medications. Camp does not have a pharmacy, and doesn't stock other medications than what orders have been written by our camp physician.

- If a parent desires another Over-the-Counter medication to be used [i.e. Claritan or Zyrtec], they would request that their medical provider write an order in the **B p2 Medication** section
- This form is online at the CT Yankee website.
- **Authorization to Self-Administer:** This is ONLY for emergency medications [i.e. Albuterol Inhaler, EPI Pen]...life or death. All other medications go through the Health Office.
- This form is online at the CT Yankee website.
- **Adult Meds Go Through the Health Office!** CT State Law dictates NO medications in the campsite.

If you have any questions or concerns, I'd much rather discuss them with you sooner than later...like walking in on Sunday of your arrival. So please feel free to contact me.

As in past years, physicals will be reviewed in a timely manner [please remember my main job of health care week 1 and beyond is to the campers there at camp]. I will send a "hit" list of problems to the unit leader or contact person for review and correction prior to arrival at camp for your week.
